Teaching Suggestions

- Prefix and suffix trading cards can be studied and completed 1-2 at a time or in larger groups. Storage pockets are provided for each set of cards with detailed instructions for assembly.
- As each prefix or suffix is introduced, encourage students to find each one in the dictionary along with word examples. Challenge them be "word detectives" and use the examples to figure out the meaning of the prefix or suffix.
- Storage pockets are ideal to be glued inside language or reading notebooks. Simply glue the grey box to a journal cover or page and students can add prefix and suffix cards as they are studied.
- Prefix and Suffix Trading Cards can be used during literacy centers, for spelling practice, during dictionary studies, or during word building activities.
- Extension suggestion: Have students write 3 sentences on the back of each card, one for each word example on the front.
- Blank, customizable cards as well as answer suggestions are included in the last the last three pages.
