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

*Attach colored center headers with instructions to the front of mailing envelopes, plastic tubs, or colorful shopping bags.

*Make copies of enough student templates for each child for each of the 8 centers (some are half sheets), and put the copies inside the envelopes, tubs, or bags and place in an easily accessible area of your classroom.

*Students will need a pocket folder or file folder to hold center work that is either completed or in progress. Their tracking chart (page 5) needs to be stapled inside.

*Review center instructions and expectations as class that include the following:

-Students may complete centers in any order they choose, which keeps their interest levels high, but they must completely finish a center before beginning a new one. There are two options for every center. They must complete their whole list "once" before beginning the "twice" column.


-On their tracking chart, they need to mark an X with a pencil in the matching box when beginning a center, then color it in with a crayon when it is complete.

-I would suggest that for optimal work quality, no more than 2-3 centers should be completed each day.

*Since there are many possible center options, this center management system will easily last for 2-3 full weeks during regularly scheduled center time. Perfect for those hectic weeks leading up to Summer!!

Center Descriptions

1. Snow Cone Spelling	Students use weekly spelling lists or a list of teacher chosen words and choose two snow cone activities to complete on separate notebook paper.
2. Perfectly Poetic	Students write one of two poem options: 1) ABC Memory Poem (instructions included) 2) Cinquain Poem for Mother's Day or Father's Day
3. Best of the Best	Students make a "Top Ten" list based on one of two topics, then draw picture of five items on the back.
4. You're Unforgettable!	Students write a friendly farewell postcard to a teacher or classmate
5. Amazing Accomplishments	Students create mini-booklets to celebrate three new things they can do since entering this grade.
6. Sun-sational Searches	Students use classroom or library books or environmental print to search for one of four word types, then write sentences to match.
7. Wet and Wild Opinion Writing	Students choose one of two "Would You Rather?" writing prompts, then write reasons and examples in one of the provided organizers to support their opinions.
8. Blazing Book Review	Students choose one of their favorite picture books or chapter books that they've read this year and complete a book review to match.


