SENTENCES & FRAGMENTS

A **SENTENCE** is a group of words that tells a complete thought. It has both a subject and predicate.

My lunch is in my backpack.

What did you bring to eat?

His lunch bag is missing!

A **FRAGMENT** is a group of words that does not tell a complete thought. It may be missing a subject or predicate.



TYPES OF SENTENCES

A **STATEMENT (DECLARATIVE)** is a sentence that TELLS something. It ends with a period.

A **QUESTION (INTERROGATIVE)** is a sentence that ASKS something. It ends with a question mark.

Do you have an extra pencil?



A **COMMAND (IMPERATIVE)** is a sentence that ORDERS someone to do something. It usually ends with a period.

Share with your friends.

An exclamation (**EXCLAMATORY**) shows STRONG FEELINGS. It ends with an exclamation point.
