Suggestions for

Organization and Management

*Print colored center headers on cardstock and/or laminate for durability. Attach headers with instructions to the front of large grocery bags or spring themed gifts sacks. They will also fit perfectly inside a library sized pocket chart as used in my Literacy Centers Made Easy! packages. Dollar Tree and Walmart both have lots of cute options for sacks.

*Print and make copies of enough student templates for each child for each of the eight centers (some are half sheets), and put the copies inside the matching treat bags or buckets. You will probably want to copy extras for students who complete centers twice. Place the bags in an easily accessible area of your classroom.

*Students will need a pocket folder or file folder to hold center work that is either completed or in progress. Their tracking chart (page 5) needs to be stapled inside.

*Provide access to a small basket of March themed library books (St. Patrick's Day, spring, plants, weather, basketball, etc.)


*Review center instructions and expectations as a class that include the following:

-Students may complete centers in any order they choose, which keeps their interest levels high, but they must completely finish a center before beginning a new one. Also, they must complete their whole list "once" before beginning the "twice" column.

-On their tracking chart, they need to mark an X with a pencil in the matching box when beginning a center, then color it in with a crayon when it is complete.

-I would suggest that for optimal work quality, no more than 2-3 centers should be completed each day.

*Since there are many possible center options, this center management system will easily last for 2-3 full weeks during regularly scheduled center time, depending on how often your class has centers. Perfect for March!



Center Descriptions

1. Shamrock Spelling	Students use weekly spelling lists and choose two activities to complete on separate note- book paper. They color in the shamrocks for the activities they choose.
2. Lucky (hoice (Writing Prompts)	Students choose a March themed writing prompt and use the attached template to write.
3. Marvelous March	Students make a "Top Ten" list based on one of two topics, then draw pictures of five items on the back.
4. Charming Comprehension	Students complete a fiction or nonfiction foldable flipbook using any March themed book. Books about St. Patrick's Day, spring, or basketball are great choices.
5. Golden Words	Students use a dictionary to search for vocabulary words, then write the page number, part of speech, and guide words.
6. Searching for Spring	Students use March themed classroom or library books to search for a type of word, then write sentences for each.
7. Spring Haikus	Students write a "haiku" poem about spring, then decorate the template.
8. Colorful Characters	Students choose a book character and write about him or her in a "rainbow" of colors.
